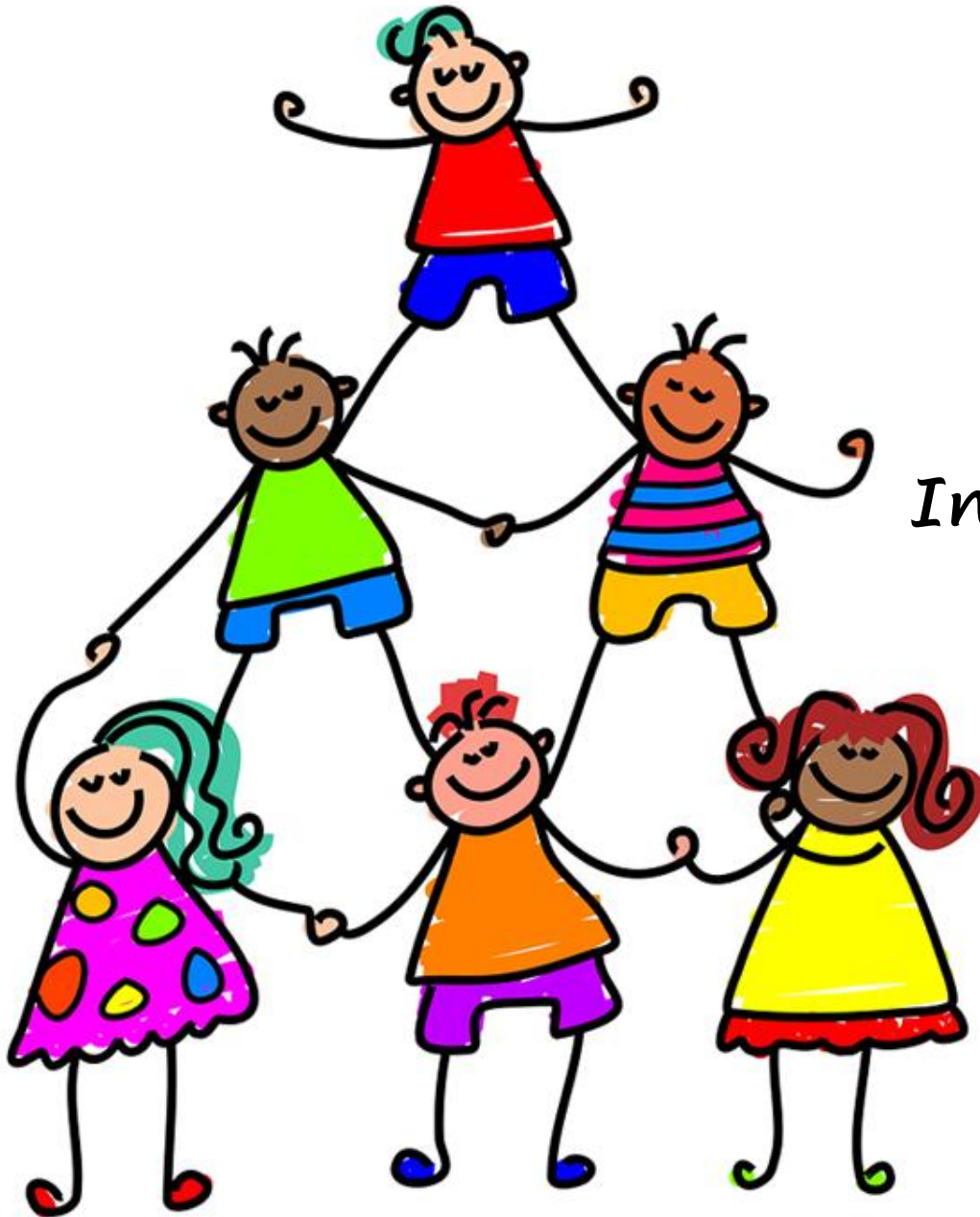

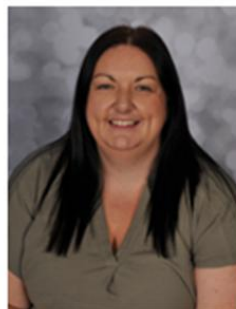

- Work and play safely and tell a trusted adult if you feel unsafe

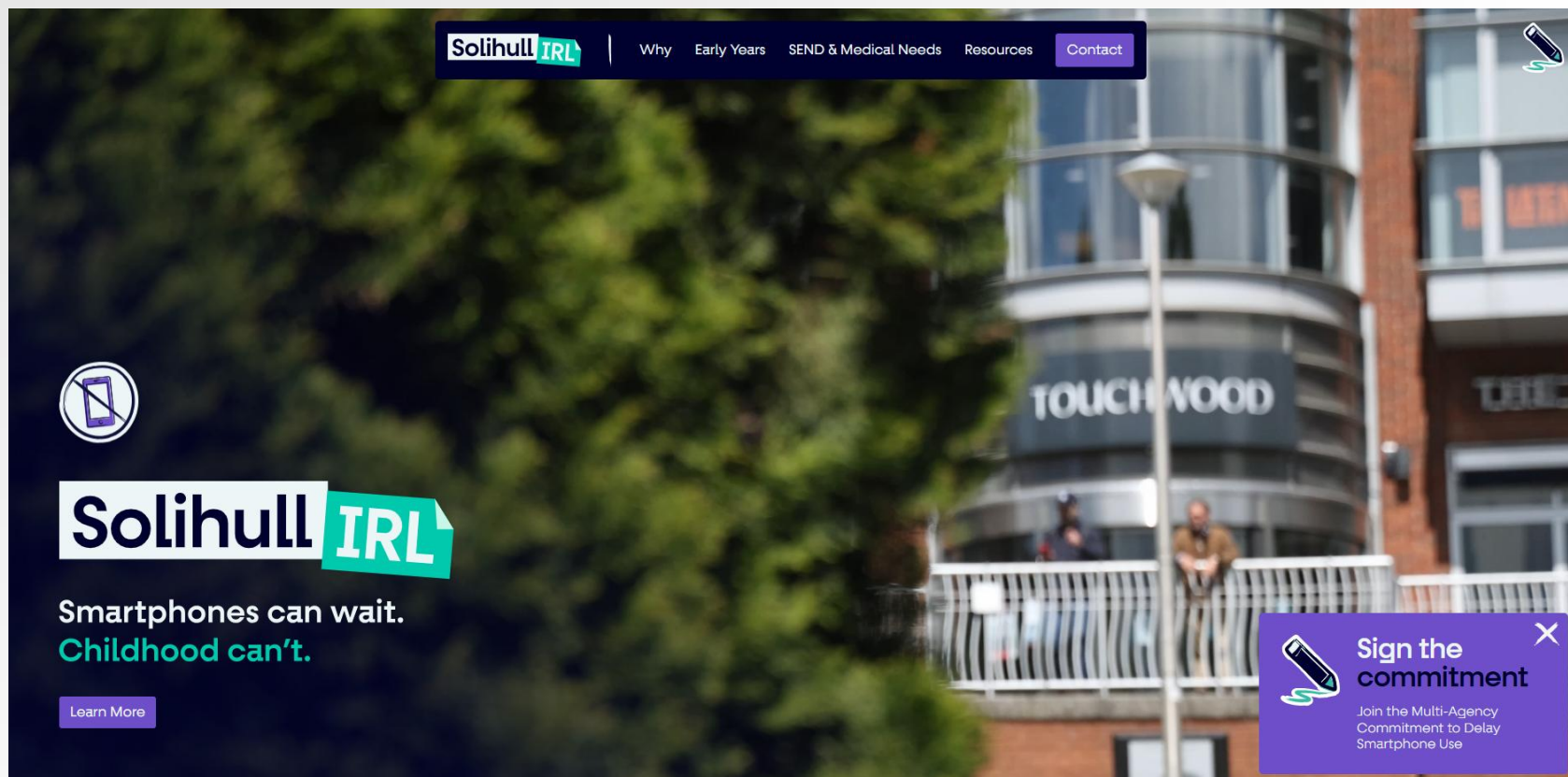


PSHE Updates & Nurture at Streetsbrook

After 3 'in school' reading sessions each book will be uploaded to your child's e-library. Please listen to them read, celebrate their success and talk about the book together. This reading is recorded electronically **we will no longer be using paper reading diaries for this purpose.** Re-reading supports fluency and understanding, all allocated books stay in the e library

Reading for Pleasure

Parents can have the most impact by promoting and supporting a love of reading. Please use our vast range of **sharing books** or books from other sources, such as local libraries. All reading can be logged on our new **Reading for Pleasure Log** sheets. As children mature they can begin to record their reading independently .

Educational Visits

Educational Visits undertaken by Streetsbrook fall into two distinct categories .

Local Area Learning:

Visits/activities undertaken within a specified local area as part of the normal curriculum and during the normal school day. Parents will be advised as to where and when these visits will take place but no transportation will be involved. A Local Area Risk Assessment will be in place.

Non Local Area Learning:

Visits/activities undertaken outside the Local Learning Area. Parents will be advised as to where and when these visits will take place. A bespoke Risk Assessment relating to this Educational Visit and the specific children involved will be in place. They are vetted and approved by Streetsbrook's Educational Visits Coordinator (EVC) Mrs Elspeth Miller. Visits outside the Local Learning Area also require final and formal 'approval' by the Headteacher, Mrs Louise Minter.

All Educational Visits are recorded on 'eVisit Planning' in line with LA guidelines



Funding Curriculum Enrichment

Activities planned to support and enrich the children's learning are paid for via Parent Pay

This includes:

- Educational visits and visitors
- Incidental resources such as cooking ingredients

The costs are worked out on a per pupil basis which means if we don't have enough income the activity cannot take place.



Parent Code of Conduct

The Parent Code of Conduct can be found on our website.

The school takes instances of inappropriate behaviour very seriously and will not tolerate any circumstances that may make children, staff members and other members of the school community feel intimidated or threatened. Parental behaviour that the school does not tolerate includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Sending abusive, aggressive or threatening messages, emails or other communications to any member of the school community
- Writing or posting abusive, offensive or defamatory comments about an individual or the school, including on social media
- Approaching another parent or child to discuss or reprimand them because of an issue between children
- Frequent or repetitive meetings about an issue that has already been dealt with
- Approaching staff through any social media platforms e.g. Facebook, Instagram

Such actions are regarded as bullying and intimidating; in the event of any of these, the school will respond proactively to support their staff.
