

How we intend to use our Pupil Premium Allocation in 2020-21

In 2020-2021, we will receive a Pupil Premium allocation of £28,864. This amount is based on the numbers in the table below.

The school has identified the following as barriers to learning for some of the children in receipt of pupil premium:

- some children also have an identified SEND
- some children are not achieving the expected standard in reading, writing or maths
- some children have a specific SEMH that impacts on their learning
- some children show a lack of resilience which impacts on their self-confidence when approaching independent learning
- access to extra-curricular trips and visits

Pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant are identified in each year group and their progress is rigorously assessed and tracked on a termly basis.

The outcomes of the data analysis, along with feedback from staff as part of termly Pupil Progress Meetings, drive the targeted support. Based on our knowledge and experience of how children learn, highly focused small group and individual interventions are put in place to ensure that all children make good progress regardless of any vulnerabilities that they may have.

The effectiveness of our Pupil Premium Strategy is reviewed on a termly basis and is reported to Governors as part of the Headteacher's termly Report.

If you are currently in receipt of one of the following:

Qualifying Benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Jobseeker's Allowance -income-based (JSA)
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
If you receive both income-based and contribution-based JSA/ESA you should still qualify if the amounts you receive are the same or if income-based part is higher. If however, contribution-based part is higher you will not qualify
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an income that does not exceed £16,190
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit (Evidence of this benefit will be required)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Solihull Council will be able to identify if Streetsbrook Infant & Early Years Academy will qualify for extra funding which can be spent on various activities including extra tuition, sports and music. Completed forms should be returned to school or during school holidays to the address found on the form. If your application for free school meals is approved you will not need to re-apply each year unless your circumstances change.
